	(b) Appraisal Committee – Staff Appraisals (Minute 2488 (a) refers)	
	The Head Teacher summarised the findings of the staff appraisals by staffing groups as follows:	
	 34 Teachers (2 are on maternity leave.) 28 Teachers passed, 4 partially passed and 6 awarded pay progression. 5 Administrative staff all passed, 3 awarded pay progression. 18 Support Staff, 10 passed, 3 partially passed, 3 awarded pay progression. 4 staff on Leadership Scale, all passed but none are eligible for pay progression. 	
	Sample targets were looked at and one HLTA target is to be made smarter.	
	Q Are there any forced rankings? A No, all can pass or not.	
	It was noted that staff on Main Scale are eligible every year for pay progression but those on Leadership Scales, Upper Pay Scales and HLTA are eligible every 2 years with 2 successful appraisals. If staff are at the top of the scale they are not eligible. This is all set out in the pay policy.	
	Q How many staff have reached the top of UPS3? A 18	
	Q How are staff kept motivated? A They need to keep achieving successful appraisals or could drop down scale.

2508. RESOURCES & FINANCE COMMITTEE	The Resources and Finance Committee met prior to this meeting and the following were discussed:

	 Revised Management Accounts for the year ending 31 August 2017 which showed a surplus including accruals of £175k which is very positive. This surplus includes the expenditure on the lighting. Future year projections are looking positive to 2019/20 but a dip could be expected in 2020/21. 	
	Q Does the surplus include money from conversion?A No, this went into the MAT budget.	
	Q What is the total budget? A £2,111,687.	
	Q Is it good to carry this amount of surplus?A The Trust has regulations about the amount of surplus as the Trust needs to remain solvent	
2509. STANDARDS AND EFFECTIVENESS COMMITTEE	The Head Teacher presented Year 6 and Year 8 data, that for Year 6 being updated SATS data. It should be noted that National scores went up so our relative progress scores went down.	
	The coasting standard in 2016 was -2.5 in Maths & Reading and -3.5 in Writing. We may be below the coasting standard in Maths again at -2.67 (the figure has not yet been released) but above coasting in Reading and Writing.	
	Disadvantaged children are above coasting in Reading but below in Maths and Writing. At the beginning of Year 6 we inherit a very large gap.	
	Q Does this show closing the gap?A No, the gap is similar, but the gap closes from Year 6 to Year 8 and by Year 8 disadvantaged pupils are doing as well as others nationally.	
	Q Is SEN included in Disadvantaged? A No, disadvantaged pupils are generally FSM6, free school meals in last 6 year, a

	poverty issue but there is an overlap between SEN and disadvantaged which can be identified.	
	55 children have FSM and approximately 100 disadvantaged children but this varies by cohort year-on-year.	
	Data by Teaching Sets shows progress scores for each class this was done by going back to the GL data. The English data for disadvantaged children shows some anomalies which need investigating.	
	GL data has been used to test out theories in more detail.	
	Mrs North is to come into school after half term to review school data.	
	The Year 8 data is normally based on tests carried out at Shelley College but this year there has been a problem with the data which as yet cannot be relied on.	
	Fortunately we did Mock tests at the end of May which gave an English Scale Score of 112 compared to the NA of 100, with 52 children above average.	
	Though girls performed better than boys, both boys and girls were significantly above the NA.	
	The cohort is not very diverse in terms of ethnicity.	
	FSM PP 103.6 and non-PP 113.6, 36 pupils above NA.	
	Maths – 117.2 overall, very strong with 65% above NA. Boys and girls significantly above NA and FSM 107.6 significantly above NA.

	So the gap in Year 6 has gone by Year 8 and above NA. Last year the results from tests sat at Shelley College gave 108.8 in English and 114 in Maths.	
	The Chair thanked the Head Teacher from the Governing Body for all the progress that has been made.

There is a formal and complex bid process for CIF (Condition Improvement Funding) which the MAT Finance Director considers needs a professional bid writer as bids are required in by early December 2017.	
	To aid the bid process the Chair proposed that with the experience of 2 landscape architects on the Governing Body it would be possible to get a robust bid with a tight specification and cost based on a Design & Build tender with a performance

	A A decision on the funding would be expected by Easter 2018 with the works undertaken during the 2018 Summer holidays.	Mr Lyne

	Q Will getting robust Design & Build tender quotes improve the bid writers performance?	
	A Yes, this should be seen as a positive in the bid process.
